

Dear Tenant/Property Owner,

I am the Environment Agency Community Engagement Officer for Northumberland, specialising in helping to improve the flood resilience of communities, businesses and schools throughout the County.

This letter is to inform you that you are living in an area at risk of flooding and to offer advice and guidance on how you can improve your resilience to this potential risk. Check your flood risk by visiting www.gov.uk/checklong-term-flood-risk or scan the QR code.



The most important thing you can do is to sign up to the free Flood Warning Service which uses telemetry to provide flood warnings to at risk properties when river levels start to rise. The FWS provides three stages of warning, see below:



Flooding is possible, be prepared. May observe flooding of low lying land, riverside footpaths, roads and promenades



Flooding of homes and businesses expected. Take action to protect property (implement personal flood plan, grab bag and keep checking weather).



Reserved for exceptional flooding situations. To warn of significant risk to life or significant disruption to community.

Prepare

Flood Protection

Insurance

Make sure that you have the right level of insurance cover needed, including building and contents insurance. Visit www.floodre.co.uk or scan the QR code.

Weather

Regularly check for weather updates. Visit www.metoffice.gov.uk or scan the QR code.





Fly Tipping

Fly tipping or littering in and around rivers and watercourses can cause pollution, harm wildlife and can lead to blockages which can cause flooding. Report any fly tipping to online.northumberland.gov.uk or scan the QR code.
